One important event at Conference is the Motions process - the annual chance for Group members to debate and vote on motions to the Board that aim to influence Friends of the Earth's work.

However there's a widely held view that the motions process is ineffective and clunky and, although motions are adopted, they rarely lead to a solid outcome. For that reason, a Board "working group" was set up to develop a new approach to motions that is more fulfilling, effective and empowering. The Board's new proposal is the 3D Process and it will be implemented at Conference this year as a one year trial. Roger Clarke, the new Chair of Friends of the Earth has published a letter about this and other new refreshing Conference ideas.
