## Waste update

Since the launch of the new co-mingled recyclables and food waste collection service last month, Waverley Borough Council says recycling rates have doubled to reach over 70 per cent. This is encouraging, although we expect this figure to drop back a bit as we believe many households were storing recyclables (particularly cardboard) in the weeks leading up to the introduction of the new system and that probably pushed the figure over the **70%** mark! The long term success of the co-mingled scheme will see what percentage of the recyclables collected are re-used and not rejected at the recycling facilities because they have been cross-contaminated - but this will take some time to establish. Well done, Waverley come on Guildford?

## **Clean British Energy**

The new campaign from Friends of the Earth, Clean British Energy aims to help transform the way Britain produces and uses energy. Clean British energy is our best hope for

a clean, secure and affordable fuel energy future. A recent poll from Friends of the Earth shows that 85% of Brits want to see the Government increasing the use of clean British energy - and decreasing our



dependence on imported gas, which is driving up fuel bills. Two thirds of people want more of their electricity to come from our wind, sun and sea - which the UK has huge supplies of - and just 2% of people back more gas. *(photo supplied by Dunsfold Park Limited).*  Clean British Energy cont......

Over the last couple of years the Waverley district has seen a significant increase in the production of solar energy with the scheme which put nearly 500 arrays on council houses, up to 50KW arrays on 4 of the schools in Waverley through the Wey Valley Solar Co-operative and a large array on the Council offices in Godalming - and members of Guildford and Waverley played a key role in all of these projects. By far the biggest array in Waverley is the solar scheme at Dunsfold Park adjacent to the aerodrome. Guildford and Waverley Friends of the Earth supported this project at the planning stage. The 2MW solar array situated on 6.8 hectares of land supplies renewable energy directly to the adjacent Business Park with any surplus exported to the grid. Dunsfold Park believes this makes their business park the first in the UK to be entirely supplied by renewable energy! However, we still need to do much more to secure a Clean British Energy future.

What can you do? Switching to renewable energy and cutting energy waste is our best hope of affordable fuel bills for the future. It will boost our economy by creating thousands of new jobs. So have you switched yet to a green electricity supply? If not, why not take a few minutes to check this out on the internet by using one of the comparative sites such as

http://www.greenenergy.uk.com/. Switching is a positive action which you can take as one of the 85% who believes in **Clean British Energy**. If you are already on a green tariff, think who you know who you might be able to persuade to switch as well – friends, relatives, work colleagues or perhaps clubs or organisations you belong to – and let us know how you get on.
