Waverley Council recently organised a Solar PV Tenant Satisfaction Survey to those 460 council houses were pv panels were installed.

153 returned the survey-(response rate of 33%)



When asked "would you recommend them to a friend?", 83% of those who responded said 'yes'

68% said 'yes' when asked if a reduction in electricity bills was noticed. Some were finding their standing charges were being reduced e.g. in one case, from £24 per month to £16. Another had a Direct Debit of £25 per month which was previously just enough but was now £65 in credit. The comment "Brilliant" sums up their views well! Well done to those who persuaded Waverley Council to support this clean energy supply!

Dunsfold Aerodrome – new report published

Kathy Smyth, planning spokesman for GWFoE has explained on the website the current ostrich like attitude of Waverley Council to Dunsfold - we want people to be aware of the situation because at the moment it seems Waverley Council appears to us to be putting at risk the environment and quality of life of a wide area of Surrey.
